How Does It Work?

1. You need an Ipod, Iphone, MP3, etc with a wire connection for a computer FREE download.
2. Go to web site: www.kawarthatranscanadatrail.ca, click on podcast in menu, follow instructions. Similar process for music (songs) download.
3. Once installed on Ipod, ride, cycle or walk K.T.C.T. stopping at trail markers located centre of trail.
4. Look right or left for Ws signs (black/yellow) with number.
5. Number on Ws signs indicates selection on your Ipod.
6. Select and click Ipod, listen & enjoy educational message.

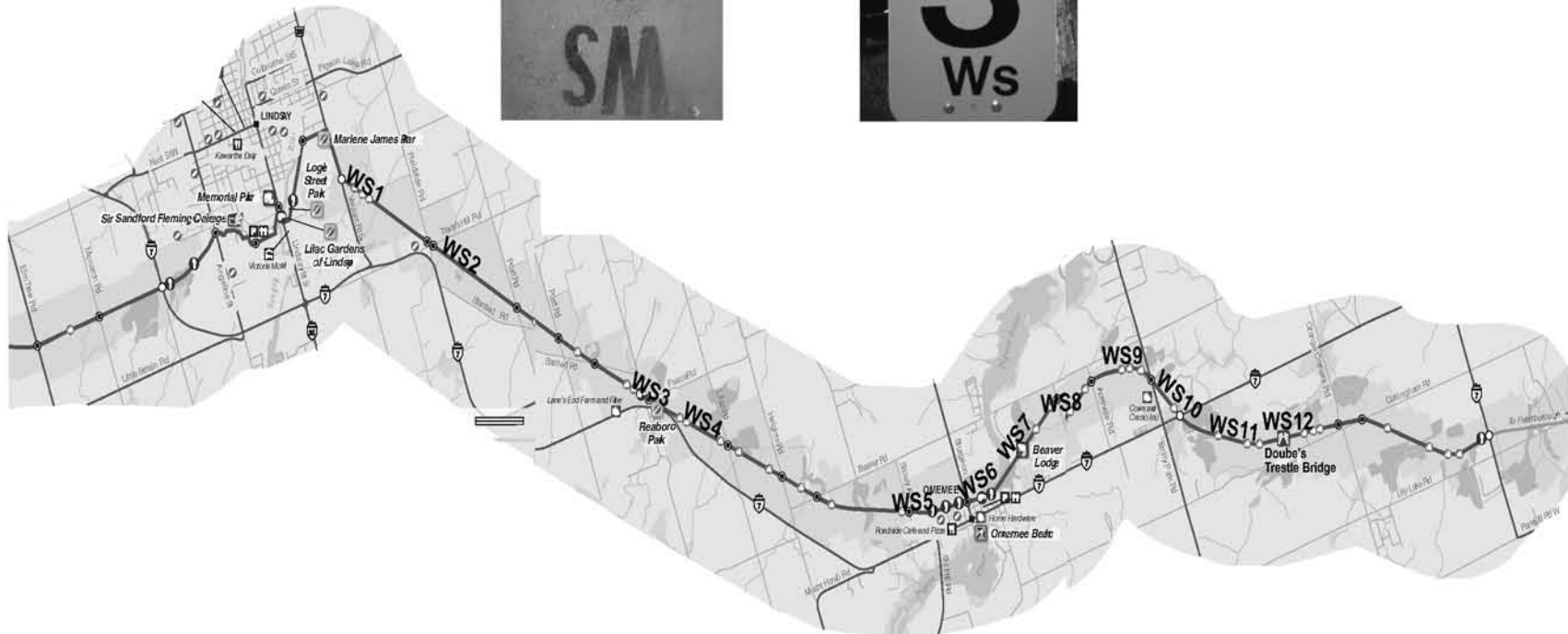
